

WHAT WE DID

- Surveyed more than 500 Arkansas voters about education freedom
- All surveyed voters are also parents of school-age children
- Weighted results according to underlying demographics
- Used mix of live calls, interactive voice response (IVR), and online panel



UHAT WE LEARNED

- Most Arkansas parents support school choice (61%)
- There is significant demand for the program (61% use or plan to use EFAs)
- A plurality of the parents who are aware of the LEARNS Act have a favorable opinion (47%)






MOST ARKANSAS PARENTS USE OR PLAN TO USE EDUCATION FREEDOM ACCOUNTS

Do you participate in the Education Freedom Accounts (EFAs) initiative under the Arkansas LEARNS Act for any of the school-aged children in your household?

















Based on what you know about the Arkansas LEARNS Act, do you support or oppose this legislation?













Results for this poll were collected by Opportunity Arkansas Foundation using an independent polling firm. The questions utilized an IVR and live call survey, as well as an online panel, from a statewide sample of 513 voters, conducted February 12–15, 2024, with a margin of sampling error of ± 4.33 percentage points. The margin of sampling errors may be higher for subgroups. Results presented may not always appear to total 100 percent due to rounding. Data were post-stratified using weighted demographic information from the U.S. Census Bureau's Current Population Survey Voting and Registration Supplement and the state election authorities. Demographic information for actual voters in past elections was used to construct sample target weights. Opportunity Arkansas Foundation paid for all costs associated with these surveys.
